

MEET LUZ AND TERRI: CSFP PARTICIPANTS

Born in Puerto Rico, Terri met his wife, Luz, in New York and later settled in California. Terri has been experiencing issues with his sciatic nerve for the past few years, making it difficult to carry items.

"We need the help. Money is tight right now. Inflation and gas prices are getting worse and social security is not enough." said Terri as he attended a Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) distribution hosted by FARSB. "I used to buy regular milk, and sometimes it would go bad or stale, and I would have to go buy more, but I'm wasting money."

Thanks to FARSB, Terri is provided with shelf-stable milk solving the issues of high prices and quick expiration dates. "I had never tried milk that comes in a carton. It's good, and I'm going to start using it," he said. Terri and Luz expressed how they enjoyed the donated beans, vegetables, spaghetti, and cereal. CSFP serves low-income adults 60 years of age or older through regularly scheduled distributions. Food recipients are guaranteed nutritious, healthy meal kits at no cost.
