The past few months have been eventful. From wildfires in our backyard to hurricanes on the southeast coast, we been hard at work supporting those in need, both locally and beyond.

In Riverside County, we partnered with the Riverside Emergency Operations Center to deliver 400 food boxes and water to families affected by the fires. In San Bernardino, local efforts were already in place, but we stood ready to assist. Meanwhile, in collaboration with Feeding America National, we sent over 22,000 pounds of disaster relief to Georgia for families impacted by Hurricane Helene. This was made possible by ALDI volunteers, who assembled 800 disaster boxes, preparing us for crises near and far.

As the holiday season approaches, we're shifting focus back to our local communities. Thanks to Albertsons Companies, 3,000 turkeys will help families across Riverside and San Bernardino Counties. While FARSB will distribute some, most will go to our amazing community partners, who will ensure families receive holiday staples.
