ABOUT US

Feeding America Riverside | San Bernardino (FARSB) is leading the fight against hunger in the Inland Empire by providing food access, emergency relief, education, and advocacy for families in Riverside and San Bernardino Counties. FARSB opened in 1980 as Survive Food Bank before later becoming Second Harvest of Riverside and San Bernardino, then Feeding America Riverside | San Bernardino. Today, FARSB is the primary source of food to over 250 local nonprofit organizations, distributing over two million pounds of food monthly to emergency food pantries, homeless shelters, soup kitchens, high-need elementary schools, senior centers, residential treatment centers, and more.

TAX-DEDUCTIBLE YEAR-END GIFT

As of March 2020, those who do not itemize tax deductions can now deduct an additional \$300 per taxpayer in annual charitable contributions. It is an "above the line" adjustment to income that will reduce adjusted gross income (AGI) and taxable income. This applies to cash, check, and credit card gifts made to nonprofits like FARSB. For those who itemize deductions, you can now deduct your donations up to 100% of your 2020 annual gross income, up from 60% previously. Donate now!
