Feeding America Riverside | San Bernardino Releases 2019-2020 Annual Report Regional Food Bank Commits to Setting Foundation for Innovation & Development

(**Riverside**, **CA** – **March 22**, **2021**) – Feeding America Riverside | San Bernardino (FARSB), the regional food bank of the Inland Empire, has released its 2019-2020 Annual Report to highlight their financial standing amid COVID-19 pandemic, the greatest need for food assistance since the Great Depression.

"Our mission is deeply rooted in supporting the community, and our annual report is a true transparent view of the work we've done, and the path we are headed," said Stephanie Otero, CEO of FARSB. "While the pandemic produced many challenges and hit sectors that directly impacted our ability to obtain needed food, we adapted to the shift and are proud of the great strides we've made towards creating sustainable solutions to food insecurity in our community."

FARSB concluded the 2020 year with having served 1.8 million individuals, distributed 24 million pounds of food, and provided over 20 million meals to local families facing food-insecurity during the 2019–2020 fiscal year.

FARSB's annual report displays an overview of financial data, a snapshot of statistical data derived from their programs and the programs of their 250 local community partners, and highlights the programs dedicated to creating proactive solutions to addressing hunger and poverty in Riverside and San Bernardino Counties.

With the help of these charity partners, they make up the largest hunger relief organization in the Inland Empire, making food security a reality for over 1.2 million people every year.
